

Are you pregnant? Live in rural or remote Australia?

The Federal Government is changing the way you'll get your ante-natal care.

- It means that your ante-natal care could be provided by carers with no midwifery qualifications nor experience.
- This care would be 'supervised' by a GP who may be at another remote location who may have no recent experience, qualifications or training in maternity care.
- This change could put your health and the health of your unborn child at serious risk.

Why should women in rural and remote Australia be forced to accept third-world maternity care?

Families living in rural and remote Australia have a right to access safe, quality maternity care from highly skilled midwives.
